


I am proud to attend my school


I feel listened to and have a voice in my class and my school community?

Do the school values help you to understand how to live together as a school




96% of children think the school's values help us to understand how to live better together.

Our values are RESPECT, LOVE and HOPE.


Does your teacher help you when you find things hard?



An overwhelming 98% agree that their teacher is helpful when they find learning hard. This reflects our feedback policy and Trust core offers.


"It helps when the teacher makes you understand."

What are you proud of achieving in class / school this year?


"I am proud of my watercolour based on Paul Thurlby."

Given a chance, what is the one change that you would like to see in your school or class?


"A smart board which is actually smart because ours is not very smart."

"That everybody is equal all the time."


"We could make the library bigger so that we could fill it with more books."



Do you have supportive classmates?




Do you think that the school provides you with enough sports / musical opportunities?






"I love our school values – they are the building blocks of our school."

96% agree that there are clear expectations and that the school is fair. This is an increase of 4% from the previous year.


I know how to keep myself safe online

100% of our children feel that they can speak about their worries. Staff create a culture where listening to the children is central to helping them.
