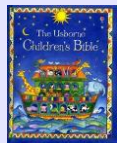
Communication and Language

Expressive Art and Design

Literacy

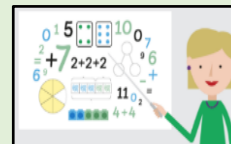
As writers and readers, we will: continue to form our letters correctly. In our Read Write Inc sessions we will learn new sounds and use these sounds to read and write sentences. We will share stories about people who help us and animals around the World.

Mathematics

As mathematicians we will: begin building numbers beyond 10 using a range of resources, doubling numbers and practising sharing and grouping. We will think about odd and even numbers and adding and taking away numbers. We will be learning to measure weight, height, length and capacity using vocabulary related to measures.



Understanding the World

As geographers, historians and scientists we will: recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.

Children will be encouraged to understand the past through talking about members of their immediate family and community.
